Council of National Defense, Women's Committee, World War I "Women's Cards" project now complete!



The Women's Committee of the Council on National Defense, Grand Rapids Unit Records consists of over 24,000 note cards containing data about women who registered for home front service during World War I. The collection provides insight into the lives of women during the early 20th century. Not only do the cards provide biographical information such as name, age, address, but they also record education levels, skills, and employment status. These cards provide valuable information for researchers of Women's history and genealogy. Watch for more news in the next issue of *Michigana* — complete with photos as well as news articles from 1918 and 1919. **Kudos to ALL who worked on this project!**

VOICES is the local and regional oral history project powered by WKTV Community Media. Their mission is "to collect, share and pre-



serve the stories of people in our community"—the stories of our lives; the stories of people from all walks of life.

They have modified a 1958 Airstream® Overlander Trailer that they turned it into a comfortable video recording studio, and are going out into the community to encourage our neighbors, friends and family to share their story. VOICES is literally a vehicle for reminding us of our shared humanity and an understanding that everyone has a story. At the same time, **VOICES** is creating an archive for your family and for the community. All **VOICES** interviews are audio- and video-recorded for airing on Channel 25 in Wyoming, Kentwood and Gaines Township (U-Verse Channel 99).


DNA Interest Group (DIG)

2018 WMGS Writing Contest

~Family Traditions ~

Traditions often enrich and strengthen family bonds and create fond memories. Whether they are stories, activities, or beliefs handed down from generation to generation, it's important to preserve your family traditions for future generations. WMGS encourages you to write about one of your family's traditions. They may occur daily, weekly, monthly or yearly, and revolve around military, holidays, or other special occasions. Some may be humorous or unusual.

Traditions may or may not be genealogical facts, but often provide important research clues. You may choose to describe how a Family Tradition assisted in your research, how you determined when and how the tradition began, or whether the tradition is based on true information or was created to teach or convince.

We would love to hear your story. Write it up and enter the 2018 writing contest!

WMGS has worked for over 60 years to educate researchers in evaluating and citing sources. Your story may inspire someone else to use new research techniques or discover a unique resource. The 2018 Writing Contest will recognize unpublished excellent genealogical writing by awarding substantial prizes. Prize winning entries will be published in *Michigana*. Like all submissions to *Michigana*, entries will be thoroughly edited before publication. Information about submitting any article to *Michigana* can also be found in the latest issue of *Michigana*, or at wmgs.org.

Rules: Eligibility: All family historians and genealogists, except the *Michigana* Editor and judges, are invited to submit their favorite story for the contest. There is no entry fee and membership in WMGS is not required.

Deadline: Entries will be accepted between January 1 & March 15, 2018.

Length: Stories should be between 1,500 and 3,000 words in length. Please cite your sources by using endnotes, and attach copies of documentation when appropriate. Family group sheets and pedigree charts should be included if pertinent. Neither documentation nor charts will be included in the word count.

Formats: Email your entry in iPages, Microsoft Word, or as a PDF.

** **IMPORTANT:** Send photographs or graphics **separately** as 300 dpi tiff or jpeg files.

Email your submission to *michigana@wmgs.org* or **ruthgen@gmail.com** with "Michigana Contest 2018" written in the Subject Line.

Identification: Include the story title, your name, your mailing address, phone number, and approximate word count. This information will only be used to identify and notify the winners.

Notification: Contest winners will be announced at the May 2018 Membership Meeting and in the next available issue of *Michigana*. Winners do not have to be present to win. Prize winning articles will be published in future issues of *Michigana*. By submitting articles, authors are giving WMGS one time print and digital rights; copyright is retained by the author. Entries may not have been previously published. All prizes may not be awarded.

The prizes: 1st prize: \$100 and 1 annual WMGS membership (total value - \$120); 2nd prize: \$75 and 1 annual WMGS membership (total value - \$95); 3rd prize: \$50; 4th prize: \$25

VOLUNTEER AT THE CONFERENCE

There a number of ways to volunteer and help out at the conference. You can volunteer at the three following places:

Registration Table: Volunteers arrive early, Tuesday through Saturday. They check in pre-registered attendees and speakers, providing them with their registration envelopes, name badges, syllabi, and meal tickets.

Vendor Support: During nonpublic hours, a volunteer checks name badges at the door. During Exhibit Hall hours, a volunteer staffs the exhibitor registration booth to assist with vendor questions and concerns. THE EXHIBIT HALL IS FREE AND OPEN TO THE PUBLIC. Support is needed at the vendor tables approximately thirty minutes before the exhibit hall opens throughout the day. Shifts vary from one hour to one hour and thirty minutes.

Room Monitor: Volunteer room monitors help during lecture sessions by greeting attendees, checking name badges to make sure attendees are registered for the conference, assisting the speaker, and recording attendance numbers. Most shifts are one hour and thirty minutes long. A cell phone is required, in case you need to call someone if help is needed.
